#### Call to Confession (based on Hebrews 4)

#### Prayer of Confession [adapted from Prayers for a Privileged People by W. Brueggemann]

**We confess, O God, that we set out to be your faithful people and then we fall into unintended brokenness. Alienated from you and ashamed before our neighbors, we seek to hide as if we could become invisible. Yet we are here, raw in our honesty, knowing that you already know what we try to keep secret. Forgive us! As we take these timid steps toward you, touch us with your unfailing love and speak to us your gracious word of welcome! Be your full, generous self for us as we begin again, obeying and loving as we can. Hear us as we ask for your mercy in Jesus' name. Amen.**

First Scripture Reading: Genesis 2:15-17, 3:1-7

The Lord God took the human and settled him in the garden of Eden to farm it and to take care of it. The Lord God commanded the human, "Eat your fill from all of the garden's trees; but don't eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, because on the day you eat from it, you will die!"

The snake was the most intelligent of all the wild animals that the Lord God had made. He said to the woman, "Did God really say that you shouldn't eat from any tree in the garden?" The woman said to the snake, "We may eat the fruit of the garden's trees but not the fruit of the tree in the middle of the garden. God said, 'Don't eat from it, and don't touch it, or you will die.'" The snake said to the woman, "You won't die! God knows that on the day you eat from it, you will see clearly and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." The woman saw that the tree was beautiful with delicious food and that the tree would provide wisdom, so she took some of its fruit and ate it, and also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate it. Then they both saw clearly and knew that they were naked. So, they sewed fig leaves together and made garments for themselves.

## Second Scripture Reading: Romans 5:15-18

But the free gift of Christ isn't like Adam's failure. If many people died through what one person did wrong, God's grace is multiplied even more for many people with the gift—of the one person Jesus Christ—that comes through grace. The gift isn't like the consequences of one person's sin. The judgment that came from one person's sin led to punishment, but the free gift that came out of many failures led to the verdict of acquittal. If death ruled because of one person's failure, those who receive the multiplied grace and the gift of righteousness will even more certainly rule in life through the one person Jesus Christ. So now the righteous requirements necessary for life are met for everyone through the righteous act of one person, just as judgment fell on everyone through the failure of one person.
